



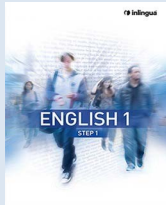

### UNIVERSITY preparation course

Next course starts on May 7, 2018

The UPC will allow you to learn English and acquire all the necessary skills to be accepted and succeed in a university or college. You will work hard on the 4 integrated skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. You will learn Academic English skills (lecture comprehension, note-taking, research, academic discussions, academic vocabulary). You will get ready for academic success in university / college. This is a 12-week program.

You need to reach the advanced level before starting the UPC University Preparation Course. You need to complete one of the following courses: Level 4B, IELTS, or TESTS.

### IELTS preparation course

Next course starts on May 7, 2018

The IELTS preparation course lasts from 4 to 16 weeks. It is a full time program for very serious students. Focus of the class is on the Academic version of the IELTS test and its four sections (Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking). There are practice tests every week. Students progress at a steady pace. Students who complete the course successfully and for 12 weeks are guaranteed a minimum overall band score of 6.5 in the official IELTS test (Academic or General Training).

### TESTS preparation course

Next course starts on May 7, 2018

The TESTS preparation course lasts from 4 to 16 weeks. It is a full time program for very serious students. Focus of the class is on TOEFL iBT, Cambridge FCE and CAE. This course will improve your speaking, listening, reading and writing skills through multiple tests, exercises, tips, advice and a breakdown of each section of each test. Students can take the TOEFL electives, or CAMBRIDGE FCE / CAE electives to focus specifically on one of these tests. You will have extra time to study and practice for the exam you need.

### Business Communication - Skills (3A)

For learners who need to improve their skills in business communication for business or professional purposes. Its emphasis is on the active involvement of learners in business communication in situations such as Planning and setting objectives, decision making, trend analysis, schedules and budgets, systems and procedures, demographic and cultural factors, and understanding the news. Learners will acquire functional communication skills relevant in professional situations such as "Discussing objectives", "Expressing opinions" and "Requesting information". This course enables learners to acquire a wider range of business vocabulary to improve their communication skills and provides comprehensive opportunities for the development of reading and business correspondence skills. Input material is based on authentic companies and subject matter.

### Professional Business Communication (4B)

For learners who need to improve their skills in business communication for business or professional purposes. Its emphasis is on the active involvement of learners in business communication in situations such as discussing environmental issues, corporate policies, discussing influential factors, dealing with complexity, risk exposure, working life, change, managing people, doing deals, selling, making or dealing with complaints, mistakes, foresight and communication strategy. Learners will acquire functional communication skills relevant in professional situations such as "Focusing on problems", "Highlighting important points" and "Discussing forecasts". This course enables learners to acquire business vocabulary so that they can communicate at a professional level. The course also provides comprehensive opportunities for the development of reading and business correspondence skills. Input material is based on authentic companies and subject matter.

 <b>Speaking &amp; Listening</b> This class has a strong focus on speaking using various topics and materials that engage students in discussion, stating opinions, agreeing & disagreeing and describing, using task vocabulary related to the topic. Topics will be presented through different listening resources such as TV shows, films, internet and/or audio clips. Students will work on developing active listening skills and how to start, continue and end a conversation.		•	•		2A 2B			
 <b>Developing Writing Skills</b> Writing in English is just as important as being able to speak in English. Students who need to improve their writing skills will practice many different aspects of writing in this class. From sentence structure to paragraphs to short essays, students will learn about the proper structure of both informal and formal writing. This is an excellent class to take if students are later interested in studying any of the exam courses - IELTS, TESTS or the UPC course.		•	•		2A 2B			
 <b>Fix it ! Speaking Clinic</b> Are you shy about speaking English? Would you like to be more confident when you speak with others? Are you not sure how to say something correctly in English? This elective course helps students to undo bad habits when speaking, constantly correcting errors in speaking and increase students' confidence in their ability to create and respond to daily communication in an efficient, accurate and clear manner.		•	•		2A 2B			
 <b>Pronunciation (intermediate)</b> Do you want to improve your pronunciation and sound more like a native? This class will begin to correct your pronunciation of both vowels and consonants in English, and also start to teach you the rhythm and stress in words and sentences. Students will begin to learn basic rhythm rules, weak sounds, linking, special intonation, and the proper use of contractions. Classes include reading out loud to isolate and practice problem sounds.		•	•		2A 2B			
 <b>Amazing Listening</b> This class is about putting your skills to the test. This class uses music, videos, TV shows and other realia to challenge student's listening abilities and stimulate conversation. The class helps students cope with real life situations where they will not get more than two or three chances to listen and understand. Over the term, the pace of speech students listen to will increase as the listening materials begin to increase in difficulty.		•	•		2A 2B			
 <b>LOL! Slang &amp; Idioms</b> Expressions used in spoken English can sometimes have a very different meaning from what it seems. However, they are used every day in informal and casual situations. Understanding and knowing when to use them will help students sound more like native speakers. Idioms are a very important part of the English language, especially in social settings. This class covers both slang and idioms that are useful when communicating with English speakers and help to understand movies, television shows and music. You will learn and use new idioms and slang in conversations and discussions.		•	•		2A 2B			
 <b>Grammar Plus</b> This course teaches / refreshes basic English skills. Learners with basic knowledge in English are able to learn / review basic grammatical structures and basic vocabulary. These areas have often become passive and can be activated and practiced in this class. Do a lot of practice exercises plus use the new grammar to speak about interesting and exciting things. **English Through Culture**

English through Culture

Pop culture constantly changes with the youth of this world, so it can be challenging to keep up with evolving trends. This course offers students a variety of modern topics such as TV shows, music, movies, sports, fashion, technology, slang and idioms that students will be able to discuss and question concerning the role of popular culture in their lives. This course will also explore the possibility of resisting pop culture and examining it from both a historical and modern point of view. The overall objective is to delve into how popular culture, in all its various forms, not only reflects the world around us but also how it influences the way we perceive the world.

Interested in what's happening in the world today? Do you follow the news, read the newspaper, check the internet for the latest stories in your country and around the world? This class focuses on using current event topics to engage students in discussions and debates. Students will learn new vocabulary related to the topics and be able to practice different ways of expressing their thoughts, ideas, opinions as well as agreeing or disagreeing. This class provides the next step in communication skills and is an excellent class to take if students wish to take any of the exam courses - IELTS, TESTS or the UPC course.

**Academic Reading & Writing I**

This course is designed to give students the skills they require to express themselves formally and prepare for future academic studies, work in Canada or life abroad. Students learn to skim materials, increase their active vocabulary and improve their comprehension of written materials. **Fluency & Accuracy**

Students will improve their communication and language skills through discussions, relative vocabulary building, consistent error correction and literature. This is achieved through an extensive amount of group and pair work in which students are encouraged to share their opinions and expand their vocabulary. It includes grammar practice and targets all of the common problems students face when trying to communicate effectively. Students also do listening exercises where they will be put in groups to answer questions, learn new vocabulary and problem solve. Students are often expected to do the short readings or written assignments for homework.

**Current Affairs**

Keep informed by reading about what is happening locally, nationally and globally. Students will have a "hands-on" approach to locating and analyzing different styles and topics of news stories via the newspaper, internet and You Tube. Learn new advanced vocabulary, phrases, idioms and engage in the chance to produce your own news story for the inlingua blog or Facebook. All included in this elective course.

**Academic Reading & Writing II**

This course is designed to give students the skills they require to express themselves formally and prepare for future academic studies, work in Canada or life abroad. Students learn to skim materials, increase their active vocabulary and improve their comprehension of written materials. The course provides students with the tools to move from simple sentence structure to forming paragraphs. Students are introduced to literature from a variety of sources including magazines, editorials, internet, textbooks and short stories. Students engage in discussions based on the chosen literature.

**ESG: English through Social Gaming**

Explore the English-speaking world through the virtual realm of video games! Students will play games that offer rich narratives and environs to explore. Participants will increase their vocabulary and practice fluency skills in an exciting new context. What is more, students will learn how to effectively interact with native English speakers in the world of online gaming and how to incorporate this dynamic medium into their English learning toolkit.

**English for Work**

This lesson covers very well the customer service industry. Topics covered in class: Resume Writing, Interview skills, Dealing with customer complaints, Role plays, How to offer extra service to customers and make more tips, Make small talk, Offer information regarding products/ingredients, Make recommendations, Introduction to fair labour practices and employee rights. The instructor will also provide tips about Vancouver's employment opportunities.

**Semi Private Lessons**

In smaller groups, students review grammar and vocabulary that they have already been introduced to and some new ideas. These lessons contain a specific topic or focus as well as specific vocabulary and grammar structures but are not as structured as the inlingua morning lessons. Various materials and approaches are used to promote participation and improvement. These lessons provide a more relaxed environment and students can receive more attention from the teacher.

**inlingua Online Learning - iOL**

iOL - inlingua Online Learning is a flexible system that complements inlingua regular lessons. Students can use the system at their own pace and contact the online teacher for support. It includes a wide range of grammar, reading and listening exercises. Students can check their answers automatically. Students can use inlingua online Learning software from any computer, tablet or smart phone at any time.
